

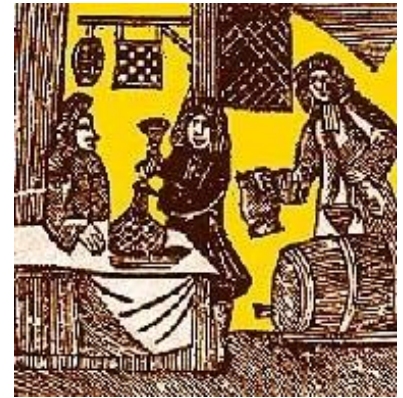


***“Colonial Tavern Night”

Congenial hosts Les and Jobie Ford will offer a tavern program featuring preparation of four authentic beverages enjoyed by 18<sup>th</sup> century tavern-goers and discussion of taverns and their importance in everyday life during our early American past.

Enjoy the warmth of the fire, sip mulled cider and hum along to popular drinking songs and music of the period by house musician Tom Harabin.
